

Flower Box by Lynn Slevinsky

This flower box provides many surfaces to embellish with lettering or visual images such as drawings, rubber stamped pictures, punched shapes or even postage stamps. Use heavy cardstock or duplex papers in heavy card weight. Try gluing a thin sheet of printed tissue paper to one side of any of the box parts before you cut them out for variety.


1) Cut out the 4 pieces and indent each along the broken lines.




2) Cut a strip of heavy paper 3/4" wide and 13" long. Glue this along the edge of the lid (piece #2) to give it shape.



- 3) Fold the remaining pieces along the broken lines, creating all valley folds.
- 4) Glue piece #3 in the centre of piece #4. Fold petals in.
- 5) Glue pieces #3 and #4 into the centre of piece #1.



6) Place the completed lid on the box, bringing the 4 sides up to form the sides.



*Note: any lettering or decoration of the parts is much easier to do before the parts are put together!
